Dear Sir or Madam

I am Project Manager for planned works at Going Lock this year, including:

- Refurbishment of areas on the Lock Island
- · Repairs to the banks leading to the Paddle and Rymer Weir
- Resurfacing of the Thames Path and the 24 hours moorings downstream of the lock

My email to you today is in reference to the Thames Path resurfacing. As you may be aware, the existing surface can get slippery when wet, so we are proposing to replace this with an improved surface, reducing the chance of slips and falls.

Key other requirements are that it is low-carbon material and can withstand annual flooding. The proposed material is Aggregate Industries Super Low (link here https://www.aggregate.com/superlow), and a primary consideration of ours is that the appearance matches the expectations of you and other stakeholders.

Our planned colour is asphalt black/grey, similar to the car park surface below, and we would like your feedback to check you are happy with this option.



For note, I am applying for a Thames Path Closure, thereby diverting the route as per the attached. I believe this diversion is a commonly used route when the Path is flooded or other works are taking place. We currently anticipate starting works in April and the closure being in place for 4 weeks. I also feel it appropriate to mention that while we will be improving the ground around the benches along the route, including for wheelchairs, we will not be removing or affecting the benches.

Please let me know if you have any comments or queries regarding this or any aspect of the works to be undertaken

We will be shortly providing further notice of our plans to local residents, so there is sufficient notice given, and are also consulting with the county and district councils.





Goring Lock downstream towpath replacement – Thames Path diversion plan





Notice of Temporary Traffic Order Goring, Goring Lock (Thames Path) RG8 9AE Date of Order: 28 March 2022 Coming into force: 4 April 2022

This Order is being introduced because of replacement of 200 metres of towpath surface to a non-slip material by the Environment Agency which is anticipated to take one month to be completed.

The effect of the Order is to close temporarily Goring Lock (Thames Path) at RG8 9AE.

Exemptions are included for emergency services, for Works and for pedestrian access to premises which are only accessible from the closed section of Goring Lock.

The alternative routes for this closure are from the bridge continue along the High Street towards the village centre - then turn right along Manor Road following the public footpath past the Rectory Gardens - continue to right turn down Ferry Lane (opposite the John Barleycorn pub) - continue down Ferry Lane - then over the grass (Ferry Lane Open Space) to re-join the Thames Path.

Appropriate signs will be displayed to indicate when the measures are in force.
