

Minutes of a Council Meeting of the Goring-on-Thames Parish Council

Monday 27th February 2023 at 19:30, Bellême Room, Village Hall

Meeting started 19:30
Public Session – Prior to the Start of the Meeting

MoP1: Representing the Croquet Club; He hopes anticipated results are fair, and believes that Croquet & Bowls are for all and the only sport to cater for the physically challenged or "older" sports player. Croquet has seen club grow, covering Bowls as well, arranging sessions for care homes etc. They will encourage Saturdays for juniors, match play and hold taster sessions for all. The green can be used all year round, being frequently/fully used. He supports option 1

MoP2: Re: Set up Goring mums support group during lockdown, is excited about the playground, it would be great to have something to share with the village.

MoP3: Re Speaking on behalf of the Whatsapp groups of parents. She was part of the previous group of teenagers that campaigned for a skate park, now a generation on, pleased that change is finally on the way, but a few swings will not do it. Make it bigger, improved, let children enjoy being away from in front of screens. As we move forwards, think how to future proof the play spaces. Saddened by a comment that playground should not be made bigger as it might affect pitch run off, asking for balance. Strongly supports a pump track, they are largely self-policing as skaters will protect their own environment. It also gives a place for toddlers to learn how to ride bikes. Volunteered to be part of the committee to take this forward

MoP4: Volunteer at the Lock, heard many comments saying Goring doesn't have easy river access, he's tried to find any guaranteed right of way to any of the old ferry sites, and the definitive shows a RoW over the open space to the tow path. The lock is dangerous, an unsuitable place to launch. River access is a big thing, with changes in working patterns, more time outside improves mental health. British Canoe club funding grants of up to £10k for improved river access, signing etc.

MoP5: A river user actively involved in canoeing, kayaking etc. Noted that in the 60s/70s GPC had access for small rivercraft proposed but nothing happened.

MoP6: He doesn't mind what is done, just do it quickly so his kids can benefit from using new facilities.

MoP7: Representing the Cricket Club (CC): A year ago the CC submitted a plan for new nets on the bowling green site, as the Bowling Club said it was moving then stayed, the CC then paused the process as didn't want to push out the BC which then folded saying facilities inadequate. Currently in pre-planning permission for new completely enclosed nets (36 yr warranty /minimal maintenance) are critical for safety as the current nets are homemade / open ended, not as safe. The issue with option 1 is there is currently not enough width so would lose trees or planted border. Enclosed nets will encroach on the field inc football pitches, which takes off a huge chunk of the recreation ground. Visually better on the self-contained bowls green, excited they could create elevated public viewing area with landscaping so people can watch the sport. They have 300 club members in academy,. Capacity issues, they are turning away kids, new women/girls cricket teams very popular. There is a community benefit, with free, year round net access to the whole village when not being club used.

MoP8: had the Cricket Club considered anywhere else to put nets other than the two sites suggested? Cricket Club replied explaining the other side of the pavilion is not big enough and the Cleeve end is too damp with the trees **MoP9:** Took Croquet up 2 years ago, delighted at the opportunity to play, feels it would be vandalism to remove the bowls green and force them to move to Sheepcot.



MoP10: Representing Goring FC; Wants the community to work together, without any divisions. Gardiner proposals to improve drainage will enable better class of football. There is lack of pitches in the village with 150+ children waiting to play football. To give current and future generations somewhere to go, the Football Association is offering grants of up to 90% of cost of 3G all weather pitch which could be used all hours, multiple games at the same time, inclusivity for all including walking football, better surface for a new disabled team or any who cannot play on uneven grass surfaces.

MoP11: Representing Goring Robins; it is their 50yr anniversary, teams are on the rise, in last few years grown to 350+ children, families being split due to lack of space. Plenty of capacity to run teams just not space. Not striving to be supersize club, responding to local demand. Pavilion, car parking etc all need to improve. Using out of area pitches but future use of them is unsure, and many are travelling 15/20 mins outside the village to use others facilities.

MoP12: Balance community desires with club needs. The green is not unused, it has been repurposed by croquet. If cricket moves in, it will cause the demise of two sports- croquet plus bowls.

MoP13: Don't waste time, start moving forwards, if you make the spaces beautiful, they will stay that way, as it encourages respect and improves for all.

MoP14: Asked if council purchase more space to enable more to be done.
